

Guidelines for Creating Your Wedding Ceremony Itinerary:

Below are some tips and explanations for organizing the flow of your wedding ceremony. The sample itinerary below outlines a traditional ceremony, however every wedding is different. The following example is intended to be only a guideline. In some cases we may make suggestions based on our experience, but the final decisions are always yours. Please discuss any questions or concerns you may have

with your agent. Your itinerary sheet should be sent to 518 Entertainment no later than 30 days prior to your wedding date.

Important to have a contact who is not in the wedding party to cue the musicians when it is time to start the processional.

Excessive sun, heat, cold, wind, rain, mist, wet grass and lightning can pose serious problems to instruments and/or render performance impossible. Acceptable temperature for outdoor performances is between 65° and 92° F. We recommend that you secure an alternate indoor location well in advance of your event in case of inclement weather.

If an aisle runner is used, the performers can play "fill-in" music as it is rolled out.

Background music to be played as guest are being seated. Typically begins 30 minutes prior to the processional.

If you're planning a special ceremony during the service (like the unity candle) that requires musical accompaniment, be sure to include it on your itinerary (Examples: rose ceremony, sand ceremony, foot washing ceremony, and many other culture-specific ceremonies).

Background music to be played as guest are dismissed.
